- D. TREASURER'S REPORT:
Balance of \$1,280.00 less outstanding bills from survey will leave us in a deficit position - Report same as last month. Directors will get together and discuss some fundraising campaign ideas.
- E. SOCIAL MEDIA REPORT - George Otty - The FB page has 773 likes (10 more than last month) and 800 followers (increased by 11). Two posts were made (1 with the School Trustees and 1 with the candidates)
- F. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES:

Survey 2018 - Report by Karen Zukas - Over 500 completed the survey, a 20% increase from the previous year. An analysis should be done with a comprehensive report and graphs - Cost \$500.
Motion to approve a Survey Analysis by Cheryl Woodhouse (Jazz Fest) by mid November by Karen Zukas. Seconded by Nicholas Rawcliff.
George will send spreadsheet so we can do a comparison graph from the last 3 years.

Truck Route - Declassifications to be approved by TOL. Once all paperwork is done, no more truck routes in Fort Langley!

Letter was written by FLCA and sent June 22nd, 2018, fully supporting the report recommendations to amend the Highway and Traffic Bylaw to incorporate modifications removing the truck route designations for:

Glover Road from 88 Avenue to Fraser River

96 Avenue from 216 Street to Glover Road

Mavis Avenue from Glover Road to River Road

River Road from Mavis Avenue to 240 Street

88 Avenue Avenue east of 264 Street

The FLCA also supports additional amendments to the Highway and Traffic Bylaw to designate Rawlison Crescent from 232 Street to 240 Street, and 240 Street from Rawlison Crescent to River Road as a truck route.

All Candidate's Forum - Report by Karen Zukas - We had a packed house, over 200. It was the only All-candidate's meeting to include the School Trustees. Martina Boyd who is a labour lawyer & President of the PAC ran the meeting. There were 28 candidates. Names were drawn and candidates were seated accordingly. Each candidate had 30 seconds at the beginning to introduce themselves. First candidate was given 45 seconds to answer the question, with the following ones receiving 30 seconds. There was 1/2 hour meet and greet following. One of the best meetings organized. For those of those that couldn't make it, All in One Productions live-streamed the event. Willoughby had about 100 attend their meeting.

Lesson learned - Some people wanted to RSVP. Willoughby charged \$5 towards membership. Not everyone is on FaceBook.
